Luke 13:22-30

22. “And He was passing through from one city and village to another, teaching, and proceeding on His way to Jerusalem.

23. And someone said to Him, ‘Lord, are there just a few who are being saved?’ And He said to them,

24. ‘Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able.

25. ‘Once the head of the house gets up and shuts the door, and you begin to stand outside and knock on the door, saying, ‘Lord, open up to us!’ then He will answer and say to you, ‘I do not know where you are from.’

26. ‘then you will begin to say, ‘We ate and drank in Your presence, and You taught in our streets’;

27. and He will say, ‘I tell you, I do not know where you are from; DEPART FROM ME, ALL YOU EVILDOERS.’

28. ‘In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, but yourselves being thrown out.

29. ‘And they will come from east and west and from north and south, and will recline at the table in the kingdom of God.

30. ‘And behold, some are last who will be first and some are first who will be last.’”

Presently the door for salvation is open. Once it shuts, according to Jesus in this passage, no one will be able to enter. So obviously the big question is what or where is the door, that a person may enter in before it is too late.

In John 10:7 Jesus gives us the answer: Jesus says, “Truly, truly I say to you, I am the door of the sheep.” Then again in verse 9 of John chapter 10, Jesus says, “I am the door; if anyone enters through Me, he shall be saved.”

Now is that clear enough for anyone and everyone to understand! Certainly no one hearing this broadcast will have a valid excuse for not knowing that Jesus was the door on the coming Day of Judgment.

On the other hand Jesus states in John chapter 10 verse 1, “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter by the door into the fold of sheep, but climbs up some other way, he is a thief and a robber.”

So, the next big question is “How does one enter into the door?” or more Scripturally speaking: “How does one get into Christ?”

Now to those familiar with the New Testament Scriptures, there are only two verses which specifically state how one gets into Christ. They are Romans 6:3 and

Galatians 3:27.

Again, no great mystery or technical difficulty for those who know God's Word.

But even so, few will find it according to Jesus. In Matthew 7:14 Jesus says, "For the gate is small, and the way is narrow that leads to life, and few are those who find it."

Truly there is only one Lord, one faith, one door into eternal life.
